Chapter 2, Paragraph 414.01 through Paragraph 414.03, read:

(414.01)

§110.26 Marblehead Harbor, Marblehead, Mass.

(414.02) The area comprises that portion of the harbor lying between the extreme low water line and southwestward of a line bearing 336° from Marblehead Neck Light to a point on Peachs Point at latitude 42°31'03", longitude 70°50'30".

(414.03) Note: The area is principally for use by yachts and other recreational craft. Temporary floats or buoys for marking anchors are allowed. Fixed mooring piles or stakes are prohibited. All moorings shall be so that no vessel, when anchored, shall at any time extend beyond the limits of the area. The anchoring of vessels and the placing of temporary moorings are under the jurisdiction and at the direction of the local harbormaster.

Chapter 10, Paragraph 267, read:

(267) Small craft moor off the marina and boatyard north of Bass Point and eastward of the turning basin at the head of Lynn Harbor. (See 110.1 and 110.27, chapter 2, for limits and regulations.) In Saugus River, some moor off the yacht club close eastward of General Edwards Bridge. Above the bridge they moor on the west side of the channel and above Fox Hill Bridge in the channel wherever space permits. In Pines River they moor in the narrow channel. Moorings are under control and supervision of the harbormaster, who can be contacted through the local police department. Depths in the anchorages are off Bass Point from 5 to 30 feet; at the head of Lynn Harbor from 7 to 17 feet; and in Saugus and Pines Rivers from 3 to 9 feet.
