

Publication - National Ocean Service - U.S. Coast Pilot 5, covers the Gulf of Mexico from Key West, FL to the Rio Grande. This area is generally low and mostly sandy, presenting no marked natural features to the mariner approaching from seaward. Coast Pilot 5 also covers Puerto Rico and the Virgin Islands., 2012 (40th) Edition.

Corrections

Chapter 4, Paragraph 115, read:

- (115) **Rebecca Shoal**, 43 miles W of Key West, is a small coral bank covered 11 feet. **Rebecca Shoal Light** (24°34'44"N., 82°35'06"W.), 66 feet above the water, is shown from a square skeleton tower on a brown pile foundation on the S edge of the shoal. A red sector from 254° to 302° in the light covers Isaac Shoal, Halfmoon Shoal, and The Quicksands. In September 2012, the light was reported to be extinguished and the structure unsafe; mariners are advised to avoid the area. Several 18-foot spots are reported within 1 mile SE and W of the light structure and marked by a lighted buoy.
