Corrections

Chapter 7, Paragraph 449, read:

⁽⁴⁴⁹⁾ The entrance to Bayou Terre aux Boefs, on the NE side of Black Bay, is marked by daybeacons. Local knowledge is advised. Overhead power cables crossing the waterway have a minimum clearance of 30 feet. Delacroix is a small settlement on the waterway about 8 miles S of Lake Borgne. There is a marine lift at Delacroix that can handle craft up to 25 feet. Gasoline, diesel fuel, water, ice, and limited marine supplies may be obtained. From Delacroix, a highway extends to Poydras on the Mississippi, and thence to New Orleans. The marshlands about Black Bay are used extensively for hunting, trapping, and oil development. Private lights, buoys, and daybeacons mark oil company channels in Black Bay.
