Corrections

Chapter 15, Paragraph:95, read:

Lemesurier Island is in the middle of Icy Strait, 4 miles E of the Inian Islands. **Lemesurier Island Light** (58°19'09"N., 136°02'27"W.), 22 feet (6.7 m) above the water, is shown from a small house with a red and white diamond-shaped daymark on the NE point of the island. **South Passage Light** (58°15'31"N., 136°06'56"W.) marks the SW point of the Lemesurier Island. The island is heavily timbered and has several summits. A small wooded island is about 200 yards off the NW shore. A shoal extends 0.4 mile offshore from the E side of the island and about 0.9 mile SSE from the light; a reef extends about 0.2 mile from the SE point of the island. Tide rips occur off this reef, off **Jacks Cove**, and about 1 mile E of South Passage Light. **Willoughby Cove** on the SE side of Lemesurier Island, affords anchorage in 8 to 10 fathoms in the E part of the cove about 0.2 mile off the beach; a strong eddy occasionally sweeps in a small iceberg.
