(1405) **Fire Island**, about 6 miles NNE of Point Possession, is wooded and has elevations of more than 250 feet in its central part. Near the SW end of the island are high sandhills, with bare summits. The shores are mostly high bluffs except at West Point and North Point, the NE extremity. A gravel airstrip is on the E side of North Point.
